Indiana State Fair Brewers Competition

It's that time again! The Indiana State Fair Wine and Beer competition will be held on July 9 in Indianapolis.

Submission requirements are three unlabeled bottles for each entry, accompanied by a completed entry form (available later). Entries must be recieved by late June. Jack Frey will be going up to visit on June 11, and has volunteered to take any entries from club members at that time.

There is a new twist this year. The number of entries has been growing considerably in the last few years, so the judges have decided to expand things a bit. An award will be given to the homebrew club who's members win the most Gold Medals, so wrap up some of your best and give it a shot. You never know, we all make pretty good beer, we might win!

There is also a growing need for serving stewards for the actual judging. Jim Dippel and Jack Frey have been acting as stewards for the last few years, and have reported that it's a great time and a good learning experience. Jim is planning to take his camper up for the judging, so cheap accomdations are available if you are interested in helping out. Should be a good time.

If you are interested in learning to judge beers, this is an excellent way to learn 7 pm about it. Judges usually are willing to share their thoughts with stewards.

Big Brew Day

May 14th is Big Brew Day. This is the day you drag all your friends who talk about brewing but never seem to get around to it down to Germania and force them to help make beer out in the parking lot. This is also an AHA event, so we need to get as many people there as possible.

Current plans are to brew two full mash batches and four extract batches starting at 8 am sharp. Typically it takes me all day to do a single full mash, from crushing grain to siphoning into the fermenter, but I usually don't start at 8 am, either!. Typical extract brew takes me only a couple hours, so we plan to do two in the morning and two later, depending on how things go.

We will be brewing Rye IPA and Porter, one each by full mash and two each from extract. We will hold a goodly portion of these beers to use at the Brew-ha-ha in September, along with whatever else everyone brings. I assume we

Naturally, we will need a similar number of volunteers again. Duties will include setup, teardown, hauling supplies, and serving beer. I suspect that there will be somewhat more emphasis this time on meeting Excise regulations (since it's at Aztar), so we will definitely need people with server's permits from the State of Indiana. If you would like to help out and don't have a permit, they are easy (and inexpensive for charity events) to get. See Jack Frey for more details.
