6th Annul Big Turkey Brewing Contest Winners announced at the Dec. 12 Party

What a year for the Big Turkey! We had a record 34 entries and record prizes to go along with them for the 6th annual contest. The truly amazing top prize is to be probrewer for a day at Carson's Brewery, but we also have gift certificates for those that made it to the Best of Show round and other great swag for the rest of the entries. The swag will be a random draw at the party.

Twenty three brewers (plus a couple of co-brewers) turned in 9 Dry Stouts, 7 Sweet Stouts, 5 Oat Stouts, 7 Foreign Extra Stouts, 3 American Stouts, and 3 Russian Imperial Stouts. Good luck to all of you. Be aware that we did have a few gushers in the bunch so watch that finishing gravity before you bottle, don't double dose the priming sugar, and be ever vigilant on sanitation.
